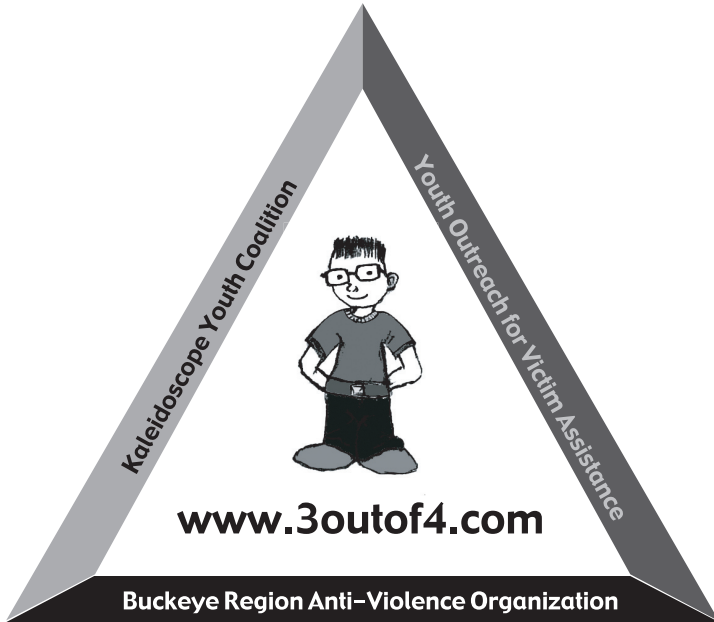

The Buckeye Ranch promotes "Silence the Violence" program. There are several components to this program. Silence the Violence Game Show is an MTV style game show conducted during school assemblies. Its purpose is to dispel myths and shows the realities of violence, substance abuse, suicide and tobacco use. They also use a decision making process called STOP (Slow Down, Think, Options, Plan) to help students learn to make better decisions. It can also be used in language arts and art class. Prevention Message Film Development involves students choosing an issue that they want to make a five-minute film about. They decide how they want to present it and dictate the entire film development process. The culmination of this project is the Buckeye Ranch Film Festival. This festival allows students to showcase their film productions.

The Family Support Program (FSP) offers group, individual, and family counseling for child and adolescent sexual abuse victims and their non-offending caregivers. FSP also provides adolescent sexual offender assessments and treatment. FSP offers a Trauma Treatment Group for victims age 3-18, a Trauma Treatment Group for non-offending caregivers, and an Adolescent Sexual Offender Group. Individualized services are also made available to the child victim, non-abused siblings, and the parents of the abused child. FSP also provides family therapy and community support revolving around sexual abuse related issues and well as reunification therapy as needed.

Impact programs understand that most teens know what the issues are around safety, but have not had the chance to learn how to respond in the moment of fear or intimidation. Impact offers training that allows teens to see how it feels and do it in a safe and supportive environment through repetitive role-plays. Teens practice saying “NO” when they mean no and “YES” when they mean yes. They practice leading themselves out of problematic situations and also learn techniques to break off physical confrontations. Impact teaches youth of all abilities how to be aware of dangerous situations, set boundaries with others, and protect themselves.

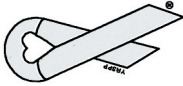
